Dear Mayor and Board of Trustees,

I am respectfully requesting to be placed on the docket for the Aug. work session. Project Knomad seeks approval to hold our annual event – Game of Skate 2017 – at the skate park in Veterans Memorial Park on Saturday, Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> (rain date 10/8). Our time needs for this area would be from noon until 6pm with the event taking place from 1 – 5pm. This event is open to the public and 'kids of all ages' are welcome to participate and/or enjoy the afternoon activities.

This year we bring a Sesquicentennial theme to our Game of Skate, and as part of the ongoing festivities we hope to include a photo gallery of our skate park at its inception and creation, one of the first in the Hudson Valley. As skating is all about community and fun, we will have music and tables for kids of all ages to create 5.5x17" banners decorated with colored marker designs that can be included in the time capsule.

The Game of Skate competition is best described as skaters performing different skate techniques in sessions (2 persons each session) with spectators on the grass. There will be an entry fee for participation in the competition within the skate park which covers our costs and provides prizes for the winners. We will be selling pizza, packaged snacks and bottled water at a nominal cost to cover our costs and any profits will go toward our next event.

PK will need access to electricity and would like to use 6-7 tables and 40 chairs from the park pavilion shed. As part of the year's activities we ask if the Village would provide portojohns at the skate park this year as we may have more participants than usual with the art tables. We also ask that the trash bins in the skate park be emptied before the event and clean garbage bags be put in them in preparation. PK will clean up after the event.

# Dear Mayor:

This proposal is at the request of Karen Emmerich of Lehman & Getz Engineering, PC. Thank you for contacting TRACKER Archaeology Inc. for your project. TRACKER can prepare a Phase I archaeological investigation on your approximate 1 acre project area in Warwick, NY. The Phase I investigations will consist of the following:

#### PHASE IA:

The Phase IA Archaeological Documentary Study will consist of an archival study of pertinent environmental, prehistoric and historic literature and maps, as well as a state site file search on the project area. Background research sources would include:

#### Archival

- -files and data concerning specific sites, located in federal, state or local institutions such as the New York State Office of Historic Preservation, in Waterford, New York. State archives will be visited as well as local libraries, and/or historical societies. Archaeological and historical publications and/or unpublished reports, maps and photographs which have relevance will be reviewed. Various historical or archaeological web sites may be visited to review any pertinent site information.
- -environmental research will be conducted to reconstruct the past and current eco-niche in which the study area is situated. This will assist in reproducing past land use and settlement patterns.
- -local informants will be interviewed as to their knowledge of any prehistoric or historic remains or the lack of any such remains.

The purpose of this phase is to evaluate the project area's potential for encountering archaeological sites and to estimate the type of site to be found, if any.

#### PHASE IB:

# Walkover Reconnaissance

The ground surface will be visually inspected by a "walkover" reconnaissance for the presence of features and artifacts of possible historic or prehistoric value. The reconnaissance will consist of approximately 15 meter transects, or less, across the

project areas to observe for prehistoric or historic features, adverse disturbances, and general topography. The entire property will be covered.

# Field Testing

The Phase IB Field Testing will consist of the excavation of shovel test pits across the project area at approximately 15 meter intervals. Shovel tests will be a minimum of 30 to 40 cm. in diameter and excavated 10 to 20 cm. or more into the subsoil, if possible. All soil will be screened through 1/4 inch wire mesh and inspected for artifacts. Notes on any artifacts, soils, terrain, vegetation and any other pertinent factors will be recorded on pre-printed forms or a field journal. It is understood that property boundaries will be demarcated prior to the archaeological field testing and any impenetrable vegetation will be cleared by owner prior to field work.

# Mapping and site delineation

All shovel tests, both positive (those containing cultural remains) and negative will be mapped on the project area map.

Archaeological site boundaries will be demarcated in the field as well as on a map. Any artifacts or cultural features encountered on the surface will also be mapped on the project area map. Photographs will be taken of the project area.

The purpose of this Phase is to determine the presence or absence of an archaeological site.

#### LABORATORY ANALYSIS:

If any artifacts of prehistoric or historic value are encountered in the field during the current project, they will be bagged, provenienced and returned to our laboratory. These artifacts will be processed and catalogued according to pre-established standards and procedures. A material culture data base, developed by the National Park Service, which ascribes function and material to each artifact, will be used.

#### REPORT PREPARATION:

After completion of the Phase I investigations we will prepare a final report documenting the environmental, prehistoric and historical findings, field methods and results, laboratory methods and results (if any) and our conclusions and recommendations. All maps, figures, field forms, State site forms and photographs will be included in an appendix.

#### SCHEDULE:

We can begin the archaeological investigation immediately upon written authorization, a hard copy survey, CAD file, and retainer. We anticipate 3 to 6 weeks for completion of the Phase I investigation if no artifacts or sites are encountered and weather permitting.

-The cost for the Phase I would be \$2,200.00. We generally request  $\frac{1}{2}$  down and  $\frac{1}{2}$  when the report is completed.

The proposal is based on knowledge of the general project area and on 40 years experience, 25 years in business, and over 900 final reports. It is also based upon total coverage of the project area as per NY State laws (NYAC & NYSHPO regulations). This proposal does not include geomorphological testing such as alluvial deep testing which may be needed on larger floodplains, urban fill testing, or burials. Additional acreage or linear feet may cost more. The proposal is good for 60 days.

Board meetings are the 1 <sup>st</sup> and 3 <sup>rd</sup> Mondays of every month and permit must be received by close of business the Wednesday before the Board meeting. Permit must be signed by a Village resident.
