Village of Warwick Bulk Trash Pick-Up

The Village of Warwick will conduct a bulk pick-up of household items beginning **August 25, 2025.**

Items acceptable for pickup include: furniture, mattresses, rugs, etc. Please refer to the Village Website, <u>www.villageofwarwickny.gov</u>, for the complete list of **Bulk Trash Requirements and Regulations**.

The Village is asking residents to place metal items separately for recycling purposes.

We <u>WILL NOT</u> pick up: garbage, leaves, brush, tires, barrels, paint, drain oil, construction debris, computer equipment, or appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, televisions, washers, dryers, stoves, etc. We will pick up 2 cubic yards (approx. 1 pickup truck load). Trash in excess of this amount will be left for the property owner's removal.

All items are to be at the curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the day noted below to ensure pickup. Once the area has been picked up, there will be **no return trips.**

If you belong to a Homeowners Association (HOA), please contact them directly for further instructions.

The Village will be divided into two (2) areas for pickup:

- Area 1: August 25, 2025 North Side of the Railroad Tracks
- Area 2: September 2, 2025 South Side of the Railroad Tracks

Dear Sirs,

I was very encouraged to see the article regarding road repairs in a recent Warwick Advertiser.

I've lived at 57 West St in Warwick since March of 1992 and been lobbying my village government all that time to effectively enforce the speed limit.

Although the current 25 MPH is an improvement from 30 MPH neither has ever been observed by the bulk of traffic.

I have written to the village, spoken at meetings, suggested valid options, taken pictures, had articles in the paper and generally for 33 years advocated for effective enforcement.

I fully recognize and genuinely respect the limits of our police departments resources and manpower.

They sincerely do everything they can but a constant presence is impossible and without it the danger goes on unabated.

The street is narrow and officers conducting traffic stops are at risk from speeding or distracted drivers, to say nothing of the uncomfortable and possibly dangerous confrontations that can occur.

Mothers with carriages, the elderly, joggers, bicyclists, and pedestrians all are at risk every day.

Hundreds of students walk home every school day often in the street when no sidewalks exist or the sidewalks are hazardous in and of themselves.

We are the main route to the middle and high schools as well as a grammar school, fire house, and St Stephens Church and a busy martial arts gym.

There are 8 side streets that access the village or county one from West St.

West Street driveways verge on the street.

Like the rest of the state and country our population is aging and continuing to drive with slower reaction times than when we were younger.

New drivers going to and from school and during the summer generally don't have the awareness and benefit of experience that comes from years of driving.

Commercial traffic is constant and includes Chlorine Tankers that take on hazardous chemicals at Jones Chemical and traverse our neighborhood regularly.

I've suggested many times that the village reach out to the chamber of commerce, churches, bus garage, village and town employees, first responders (not actively responding), PTA, school board, lumber yards and local construction companies.

All these organizations and others would set an example and slow traffic but it will not happen without enforcement that includes *all drivers*.

The requests for have been ignored and rebuffed over the years and recently.

Its seems apparent that the political will to make this neighborhood street safe does not exist or that the thought of taking this on and solving it dismissed as ridiculous and or overwhelming.

There is a baffling lack of vision in finally addressing this situation here in Warwick.

On a recent trip to Oregon I was astounded at the level of compliance that drivers exhibited in busy densely populated Portland and particularly in Medford Oregon where traffic cameras are deployed.

Cameras are a constant presence and require no confrontation or risk to our police officers. Cameras will pay for or significantly offset their own cost while creating the atmosphere we all desire in a village like Warwick.

Commercial traffic alone would yield significant income and or divert to county and state roads rather than traverse our residential neighborhood at speeds 20 and 30 miles above the limit. Our roads would last longer with lower speed and lighter use and residents would quickly

respond and comply with the speed limit.

I'm not suggesting speed traps just compliance with posted limits in recognition that we currently have the conditions that could create a death trap.

Speed kills.

Blessedly the only thing killed on West Street so far are dogs and cats and deer (heart breaking enough) but that can change literally at any moment.

Waiting to take action after a tragedy is deeply irresponsible and we've waited long enough. Cameras work, no other measures have or will.

I'm requesting your assistance in motivating and assisting our local government to Make West Street Safe for everyone whatever that takes.
