



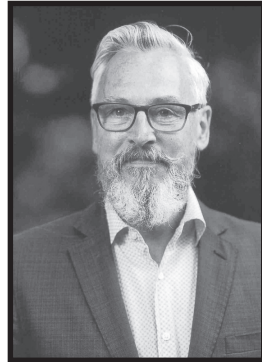

Our Summer Concert Series has already begun. In honor of our Nation's 250th Anniversary celebration, we will be hosting a community square dance on the basketball courts at Stanley-Deming Park. Be sure to mark your calendar for August 8!

The Summer Recreation Program includes our much-loved day camp at Stanley-Deming Park, as well as sports intensives in basketball, cheerleading, lacrosse, non-contact football, soccer, tennis, and track. The season is now in full swing.

Downtown has much to offer, including cafés, restaurants, and plenty of shopping. Summer is the perfect time for outdoor dining, ice cream treats, sidewalk sales, and special merchant events.

The Farmers' Market is alive with activity as more seasonal produce becomes available. Every Sunday brings something new, freshly harvested and ready to enjoy.

We have an entire Village to explore, with parks filled with recreational opportunities. The Village is also working on several exciting projects. These include the Safe Streets for All Grant initiative, which encompasses Town and Village traffic safety studies as well as creative demonstration projects through our Slow Down Warwick campaign; the Patriots Path project in Veterans Memorial Park, a walking trail featuring key historical elements that honor our veterans; and a feasibility study for a multi-use trail parallel to Route 94, a joint effort with the Town of Warwick.

The NYSDOT road project will continue throughout the summer and into early fall. We appreciate your patience as this important work progresses. Please plan accordingly and, if you are detoured through residential neighborhoods, drive carefully and respectfully. So, enjoy Warwick to its fullest and make the most of all that summer has to offer. Have fun!

## VILLAGE OF WARWICK – 2026 TAX COLLECTION NOTICE

The Village of Warwick's annual tax collection cycle begins in June. Below is the payment schedule and available methods to pay your Village property taxes.

### Payment Schedule:

June 1–July 1: No penalty  
July 2–July 31: 5% penalty  
August 1–August 31: 6% penalty  
September 1–September 30: 7% penalty  
October 1–October 31: 8% penalty

After October 31, unpaid taxes must be paid to the Orange County Commissioner of Finance (Nov. 1–15). Taxes remaining unpaid after Nov. 15 will be re-levied onto the January County/Town tax bill.

# Village of Warwick FY 2026–2027 Budget Summary

Fiscal Year: June 1, 2026 – May 31, 2027

The Village of Warwick 2026–2027 Budget has officially been adopted, continuing the Board's commitment to balancing fiscal responsibility with long-term investment in infrastructure, public safety, and community improvements. The budget remains within New York State's tax cap while continuing to maintain the services residents rely on every day.

One of the largest priorities included in this year's budget is continued progress toward the Village's \$22 million Sewer Treatment Plant Upgrade Project, a major infrastructure investment that will help modernize the system and prepare the Village for the future. The Village has already secured a \$3 million grant through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) to help offset project costs and reduce the impact on taxpayers.

The adopted budget also continues investment in the Village water system, including ongoing construction of Well #3, upgrades at the Reservoir Water Treatment Plant, Hilltop tank repairs, water meter replacements, and installation of a new Sheffield Pressure Reducing Valve (PRV) to improve system reliability and efficiency.

Public safety improvements are also included throughout the budget. Investments include electrical and equipment upgrades.

Road and pedestrian infrastructure remain a major focus, with funding included for Wheeler Avenue sidewalk repairs, annual paving projects, and the purchase of a new DPW dump truck to support operations and maintenance throughout the Village. The Village will also receive approximately \$270,920 in state road funding through programs including CHIPS, PAVE-NY, Pave Our Potholes (POP), and Extreme Winter Recovery funding.

Parks and recreation improvements are also included in the adopted budget. Residents will see new security

cameras installed at Veterans Memorial Park, the DPW facility, and the Microfiltration Plant to improve safety and security. Additional projects include replacing garbage receptacles throughout the Village, repurposing the old skate park into pickleball courts at Veterans Memorial Park, installation of heating at the Stanley-Deming Park and Memorial Park pavilion bathrooms, rehabilitation work at Fowler Garden, and installation of a new drinking fountain at the Veterans Memorial Park skate park.

The budget also supports continued modernization efforts inside Village Hall through ongoing records management and digitization projects designed to improve efficiency, organization, and public access to records.

In addition to the projects funded directly through the budget, the Village continues to aggressively pursue outside grant funding in an effort to reduce the burden on local taxpayers while advancing major community projects. Applications totaling more than \$11 million have already been submitted across all Village funds, including requests through NY Forward, Community Development Block Grants (CDBG), records management grants, federal infrastructure funding, Well #3 funding, Reservoir land acquisition assistance, and dam safety improvements.

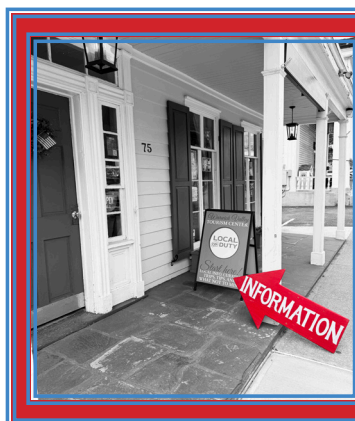
Water rates will increase by 10% this year to help support infrastructure improvements, operations, and rising costs associated with maintaining the Village water system. Sewer rates will remain unchanged.

The adopted budget reflects the Village Board's continued focus on maintaining essential services, improving infrastructure, strengthening public safety, pursuing outside funding opportunities, and planning responsibly for the future of the Village of Warwick.

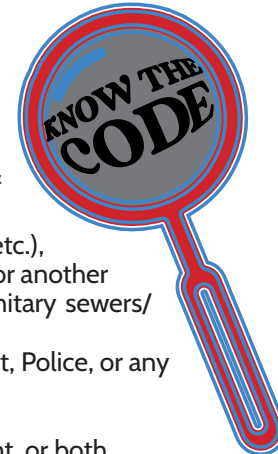

## PICKING UP AFTER DOGS

§ 36-6 Nuisances; removal of feces. [1]

- It is illegal for any dog owner/caretaker to allow a dog to foul public areas or private property without permission.
- Dogs may be curbed on the street between curblines only if the owner immediately removes feces.
- Feces must be picked up with a tool (scoop, shovel, tong, etc.), placed in an airtight bag/container, and disposed of in refuse or another Board of Health-approved method; disposal in storm or sanitary sewers/drains is prohibited.
- Enforcement may be by the Dog Warden, Health Department, Police, or any private citizen filing a complaint in Village Justice Court.
- Guide dogs for blind persons are exempt.
- Violations carry up to a \$250 fine, up to 15 days imprisonment, or both.

## LAWN MAINTENANCE

§ 102: Property Maintenance

- Clean and kept lawns are important to the health and safety of the inhabitants of the village.
- Any lawn that is not mowed will receive a violation.
- If lawn is not maintained within 10 days of the violation, the Village reserves the right to mow property at the cost of the property owner.

## CONSERVING WATER: EVERY DROP COUNTS

Our water comes from a reservoir, and as the weather becomes hot and dry, please remember this may have an impact on our water. If the reservoir becomes low, the Village may put out a suggested or mandatory water ban. Pay attention to your water usage habits, so you know, if the time comes, where you can be more conservative. Here are some tips for conserving water:



- **CHECK YOUR HOME FOR LEAKING FAUCETS AND RUNNING TOILETS.**
- **ONLY RUN FULL LOADS IN YOUR WASHING MACHINE AND DISH WASHER.**
- **RUN THE SHORTEST CYCLE ON YOUR WASHING MACHINE AND DISH WASHER.**
- **LIMIT WATERING YOUR GARDEN TO EARLY MORNING OR EVENING TO PREVENT EVAPORATION.**
- **USE A BROOM TO CLEAN OUTDOOR SPACES INSTEAD OF A HOSE.**
- **TURN OFF THE FAUCET WHEN WASHING YOUR HANDS, SHAVING OR BRUSHING YOUR TEETH.**
- **LIMIT YOUR SHOWER TIME.**
