<u>Summary of Planning-related Suggestions from Stakeholder Meetings</u>

Merchants 8/2/21

Public restrooms are necessary due to the many visitors in the Village

Parking has issues: there is confusion about when/how to feed the meters—the message at the meters needs to be clearer

There should be support for bricks and mortar stores over food trucks (How is BBQ allowed?)

The signage directing shoppers to businesses off of Main Street needs to be improved.

Priorities:

- Maintain the intact streetscape
- More parking—maybe a parking deck
- A visitor welcome center is needed
- More events should be encouraged—Downtown concerts on Friday and Saturday nights, eg
- A Business Improvement District was recommended in last plan. Does it still make sense?
- Purchasing a building is a big step to solidify a downtown business. Can there be assistance with this for merchants?
- Additional parking would be helpful: Chase Bank parking lot? Kuiken Lumberyard?
- Should parking meter time limits be increased to 3 hours?
- Merchants/downtowns stakeholders should meet regularly
- Is it possible to take traffic calming to the next level with streetscape improvements?

POWER August 6, 2021

We need diversity among volunteers that assist in the governance of the Village: would it be possible to create a BiPoC committee that would meet regularly with the Mayor to discuss issues affecting that community and also be a vehicle that the Village could use to recruit BiPoC volunteers?

Warwick Historical Society August 9, 2021

Should there be a design manual for historic district?

Create flexibility for renovations so that historic properties can be improved without worrying about having to bring the entire structure up to code if you exceed 50% of the value with improvements

Look as ways to provide financial incentives/support for local property owners through a local version of historic tax credits or other options

The Comprehensive Plan need to identify the critical resources/assets that contribute to the Village's sense of place

There need to be public restroom facilities in the Village (beyond Deming Park)

Civic Organizations 8/19/21 (Rotary, Knights of Columbus, POWER, Lions)

Is Village prepared to host festivals? Parking can be a problem. Access to water and electric power can be a problem for Railroad Green.

We need gathering spaces for fund-raisers and civic events in general.

There is a drug problem in Warwick. Could crisis counseling become more visible? Is there space available for that?

It may be helpful to have an annual meeting of Civic Groups to coordinate activity calendars. This could be a face-to- face meeting or via media such as Facebook.

Walkways to the Village could be stronger. Oakland Avenue's sidewalks are unsafe and unsightly.

Artists/Art Groups September 15, 2021 (Wickham Works, the Warwick Arts League, Warwick Center for Performing Arts, Hudson Valley Jazz Festival)

Summary of Meeting with Hispanic Community Members, October 13, 2021

The meeting was organized by Judy Battista of POWER. In addition to Ms. Battista, Mayor Newhard, Trustee Cheney and Peter Fairweather, there were 11 attendees. The discussion was organized around identifying strengths and weaknesses in living in the Village.

Economic Opportunity

Hispanics want to start small businesses and need assistance. There is no ability to translate legal documents in the village. How could we provide that service here?

We have to work hard to make the rent payments, but when we are hired it is at a low wage, while the rents are always high.

Housing prices are up and this has affected Latinos. Renting and leasing is expensive with needs for credit checks in three months security. This is increasing problem to secure rentals due to the use of credit checks and multi-month security deposit.

We are looking for skills training.

Maybe a new cleaning service could be organized among Latinas in the village.

Quality of Life

There is a lot of noise on West Street near Halligan's

It can be difficult to get medical insurance
The hospital has limited bilingual capacity to serve Hispanic patients

Are there people to help parents get involved with the school in the community That would be helpful.

Should we have bilingual signage in the village?

Overall Recommendations:

A comprehensive plan should be comprehensive — – for everybody.

It is important to keep the dialogue going. The village must send a clear sign to the community. It must include diversity on the website. We need to create an environment where we all can play, where we all can participate. We work hard and we want to taste justice and opportunity.

Every day things matter — making sure the parents feel comfortable sends a clear sign to all citizens that they are all welcome.

We need more education. Many people are not aware of the diversity in the Latino community in Warwick.

Should there be an Hispanic committee to coordinate these efforts? Maybe a monthly meeting?

It would be helpful to have a leaflet for new residents with information about how to get services and the various opportunities in the village.

The police relationship is improving. We need someone to speak Spanish on the force.

There should be a sign in Spanish for public restrooms, to make it easier for Hispanic visitors and others to find them?
