FROM THE MAYOR'S OFFICE: VILLAGE UPDATE



s we move through 2025, it's a great opportunity to reflect on what we've accomplished over the past year and highlight the progress already in motion. The Village of Warwick continues to push forward with key projects that enhance infrastructure, promote sustainability, and maintain our Village's unique character—all while staying under the 2% tax cap despite inflationary pressures.

Infrastructure & Environmental Progress:

Construction began on the Well #3 Filtration Plant and a new pump station on Grand Street. The Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades will go out to bid this spring. The NYS Reclamation Project will begin this year, bringing a new roundabout at 1A and Route 94, reconfiguration of the Colonial Avenue and Forester Square intersection, and paving improvements on Routes 94 and 17A.

Other significant efforts include the Safe Streets & Roads for All initiative, the Lead Service Line Inventory project, and sidewalk improvements along South Street, Third Street, and Galloway. Planning progressed for the Route 94 Multi-use Trail, and solar panel installation at the DPW garage is underway. The Patriots Path Project in Veterans Memorial Park is also set to begin this year.

Community Development & Recognition:

The Village acquired 75 Main Street, home of the Warwick Valley Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Center. We also opened a new Dog Park at Veterans Memorial Park, saw progress on the new skate park, pump track and will be adding kayak launches. We celebrated 40 years as a Tree City USA. Warwick was recognized as the first Monarch Village in New York State and achieved Pro Housing Community status.

Public Engagement & Events:

Over 1,000 children participated in the Summer Recreation Program in 2024. The Village hosted a wide range of annual events, including Applefest, the Summer Concert Series, the Farmers' Market, and multiple parades and festivals. The Quarterly Village Newsletter continues to inform residents of ongoing initiatives.

Innovation & Grant Success:

DPW received recognition for creating "The Fin-isher," a tool for curb box rod replacement. The Village secured over \$6.4 million in grant funding for infrastructure, solar energy, records management, and more, including major awards from Congressman Pat Ryan, Senator Skoufis, and NYSERDA.

Looking Ahead:

The work done in 2024 set the stage for continued progress in 2025. Thank you to our Village staff, Board of Trustees, and residents for your continued support.

VILLAGE OF WARWICK – 2025 TAX COLLECTION NOTICE

The Village of Warwick's annual tax collection cycle begins in June. Payment Options: Below is the payment schedule and available methods to pay your Village property taxes.

Payment Schedule:

June 1 – July 1: No penalty July 2 - July 31: 5% penalty August 1 – August 31: 6% penalty September 1 – September 30: 7% penalty October 1 – October 31: 8% penalty

After October 31, unpaid taxes must be paid to the Orange County Commissioner of Finance (Nov. 1-15). Taxes remaining unpaid after Nov. 15 will be re-levied onto the January County/Town tax bill.

BRUSH PILE

The Village of Warwick will again have the Brush Disposal Program for 2025 for Village residents. The Brush Pile will be open until November on Saturdays and Sundays from 12 p.m.-4 p.m. excluding Holidays and AppleFest Sunday.

DPW AWARDED GRANT

The Village of Warwick was one of Cornell Local Roads 2024-2025 Work Zone Equipment Package grant winners. The grant was from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee (GTSC).

The grant money went to Work Zone Workshops and Work Zone Safety packages which include signs, safety vests, cones and other safety roadside equipment to keep our workers safe when working on our roadways.

TREE REMOVAL GUIDELINES IN THE VILLAGE OF WARWICK

The Village of Warwick would like to remind residents of the guidelines and requirements related to tree removal within Village limits.

Per Village Code, the removal of any tree-whether located on private property or near the public right-of-way—must be evaluated before work begins. Several factors are considered when determining whether a tree may be removed, including:

- The health and condition of the tree
- Its size and proximity to structures or public areas
- Whether the tree is classified as a "Village tree"

Village trees are typically planted by the Village within the public right-of-way and are selected based on species suitability, location, growth pattern, and long-term viability. These trees are maintained by the Village and may not be pruned, altered, or removed by property owners.

If you are considering tree removal on or near your property, you are required to contact the Building Department at (845) 986-2031 option 8 or email building@villageofwarwick.org. The Building Department will conduct an assessment, and in many cases, the Shade Tree Commission will be consulted to determine whether removal is appropriate and if replacement planting is recommended. If you believe a Village tree is unsafe or in poor health, please notify the Village so the Department of Public Works can inspect the tree and take appropriate action.

Your cooperation helps us maintain the beauty, safety, and environmental health of our community. Thank you for doing your part to preserve the Village's tree canopy.


